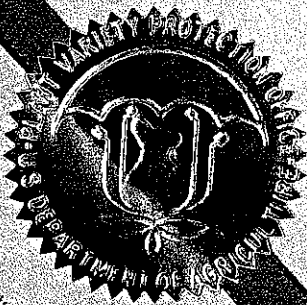



**18A. Exhibit A. Origin and Breeding History of Pioneer Wheat Cultivar 25R47.**

Pioneer® cultivar '25R47', a soft red winter wheat (*Triticum aestivum* L.) was developed by Pioneer Hi-Bred Int'l., Inc.. Using a modified pedigree selection breeding method, 25R47 was derived from the three parent cross:

WBE2190B1/WBA416H2//2552

The cultivar, WBE2190B1 was a Pioneer line derived from the cross: Frankenmuth/2555 sib./2551 sib.. The cultivar, WBA416H2 was a Pioneer line derived from the cross: Houser/MO9545//W4034D/Augusta. The cultivar, W4034D was a Pioneer line derived from the cross: GA80/MOW7510. The cultivars, MO9545 and MOW7510 were experimental lines from the University of Missouri. The cultivar, GA80, was an experimental line from the University of Georgia. The detailed parentage of 25R47 is:

Frankenmuth/2555 sib//2551 sib/3/Houser/MO9545/3/GA80/MOW7510//Augusta /4/2552

The single cross WBE2190B1/WBA416H2 was made in the 1991 spring greenhouse cycle and was designated WBN2454. During the 1991 fall greenhouse cycle the F<sub>1</sub>, WBN2454, was crossed with 2552 and the final cross designated WBP0487. The subsequent breeding history of 25R47 is described below.

1994-95	F <sub>4</sub>	A 3 row X 3-meter observation plot was planted at Windfall and Ft. Branch, IN. A meter section of the center row was harvested from each selected plot and threshed in bulk.
1995-96	F <sub>5</sub>	A seven row X 3-meter plot was planted at Windfall and Ft. Branch, IN. Fifty spikes were harvested from each selected plot and threshed individually.
1996-97	F <sub>6</sub>	Twenty headrows of each F <sub>5</sub> selection were grown at Windfall and Ft. Branch, IN. Selected rows were cut and threshed individually. This selection was made at Windfall.
1997-98	F <sub>7</sub>	Preliminary yield testing of an F <sub>5</sub> selection from an F <sub>6</sub> headrow. This selection designated WBP0487A1.

1998-99	F <sub>8</sub>	Advanced yield testing of WBP0487A1. 200 individual spikes were harvested from a small bulk increase.
1999-2000	F <sub>9</sub>	Elite yield testing of WBP0487A1. A 0.2 acre spaceplanted increase surrounding 200 headrows was grown. Offtype plants and headrows were destroyed prior to harvest. 1000 individual spikes, 110 headrows and bulk seed were harvested. Bulk seed constitutes Breeder Seed. Bulk seed, headrow bulks, and individual spikes were turned over to Pioneer's Supply Management, Parent Wheat production group.
2000-01	F <sub>10</sub>	Elite yield testing continued, line designated YW00E. Seed increase continues by Pioneer Parent Wheat Seed Group.
2001-02	F <sub>11</sub>	Elite yield testing continued, line designated XW00E. Seed increase continues by Pioneer Parent Wheat Seed Group.

Decision to release WBP0487A1 was made in August, 2002 at which time the commercial code, 25R47 was assigned.

The cultivar 25R47 was bred and selected for any and all of the following characteristics in the field environment: disease resistance, plant type, plant height, head type, straw strength, maturity, grain yield, test weight, and milling and baking characteristics.

25R47 has been shown to be uniform and stable since the 7<sup>th</sup> generation, or for the last 5 generations. Variants are limited to slightly taller plants or awnless plants at a frequency no greater than 1/15,000 in total.

**18 B. Exhibit B. Statement of Distinctness**

25R47 is most similar to Pioneer variety 2552 but with the following distinguishing characteristics:

1. The anthers of 25R47 are purple, while those of 2552 are yellow.
2. The glume shoulder shape of 25R47 is "wanting", while that of 2552 is "oblique".
3. The phenol reaction of 25R47 is "fawn", while that of 2552 is "brown".

**18D. Exhibit D. Additional Description of the Variety**

## 1. Yield and Agronomic information.

Preliminary yield testing of 25R47 began in the 1997-98 growing season and wide scale testing has been conducted from the 1998-99 growing season to the present. It has shown adaptation to the northern soft wheat regions based on tests conducted in Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, and Michigan, as well as the midsouth region of Kentucky, Arkansas and the bootheel of Missouri. (Tables 1 & 2).

## 2. Information on reaction to major diseases.

Leaf rust – excellent resistance to prevalent races in the northern soft wheat region.

Powdery mildew – intermediate resistance to the prevalent isolates of powdery mildew present in the soft wheat region.

Soilborne and wheat spindle streak mosaic virus – intermediate resistance to both viruses.

Leaf blights – intermediate resistance to the complex of most common organisms that cause leaf blights including: *Septoria tritici* blotch, *Stagnospora nodorum* blotch, and tan spot.

Fusarium head blight – slightly better than average resistance.

## 3. Information on reaction to major insects.

Hessian fly – susceptible to the predominant biotypes of Hessian fly in the northern soft wheat region. Has screened susceptible to biotypes E, and L in tests conducted by the Dept. of Entomology, Purdue University, in conjunction with the USDA-ARS Insect and Weed Control unit.

## 4. Information on Milling and Baking Qualities.

25R47 has demonstrated very good milling and baking qualities (Table 3).
