

Annual Organic Cotton Market Summary

Volume 2

Production

The 2010 organic cotton production in the US totaled 12,982 bales according to information collected from organic producers, marketing associations, and gins that process organic cotton. Production is centered in West Texas with additional acreage in Arizona, and New Mexico. The predominate varieties planted were Bayer CropScience FM 958, FM 989, and ADF 2485.

Prices

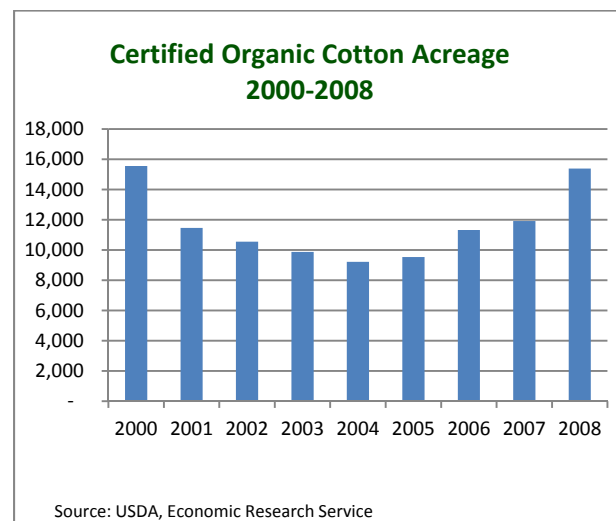
Organic cotton prices ranged from 140 to 200 cents per pound.

Cottonseed

Organic cottonseed prices ranged from 375 to 425 dollars per ton. This compares to 155 to 160 dollars per ton for conventional cotton. Cottonseed yields ranged from 650 to 693 pounds of seed per bale of ginned lint.

2011 Crop Outlook

The 2011 organic cotton production is expected to increase 10 to 15 percent compared to the previous two years as current price levels encourage additional production.
